



II. Nuclear Power Plants Istanbul Summit with the participation of Czech companies

In the days 19 to 20 March 2015 in Istanbul was supported by the Ministry of Energy and Natural Resources of Turkey second edition of Nuclear Power Plants Istanbul Summit, Czech-Turkish Chamber of Commerce is a partner country for the Summit of the Czech Republic. Summit to support their participation by representatives from the Czech Embassy in Ankara and the Consulate General of the Czech Republic in Istanbul. The event was attended by 800 delegates both domestic and foreign, who want to form a partnership for the future nuclear power plant projects in Turkey. Czech companies at the summit presented a total of eight.

Mr. Koray Tuncer, President of B2B Matchmaking Society of Turkey, during the opening speech stressed that the basic aim of this summit is to raise awareness in Turkey on nuclear energy. He stated that the majority of the Turkish population still do not realize the high price of natural gas imports from abroad and enormous energy dependence on Turkey's neighboring countries in terms of energy imports and energy resources.

Mr. Fuat Akhundov, CEO of the first Turkish Akkuyu nuclear power plant, said

that the Akkuyu in the future will generate 35 billion kWh per year and will stretch up to 14% of electricity consumption of the country. Akhundov stressed that Russia entered into the project in January and \$ 800 million overall, therefore, already \$ 3 billion.

Rosatom will build the first nuclear power plant Akkuyu with planned 4×1200 MW VVER reactors in the southwest of Turkey's Mediterranean coast, worth 5×22 billion with the expected start of operations in 2023. Construction was inaugurated on 16 April 2015. The second nuclear power plant with the planned Sinop 4×1200 MW PWR reactors will be built on the northern coast of Japan and operated by France. The third nuclear power plant is still being treated as a Favorita talk about the US and China.
